


PCI is a measure of provincial economic governance

The PCI measures actual business perceptions of provincial economic governance. PCI results are comparable among provinces, thereby promoting reform actions.








PCI 2021 and PCI 2020 are highly correlated (r = 0.75*), showing stability after 2021 recalibration exercise.








2021 Infrastructure Index Top 10 rankings







Some Areas Rated in accordance with Government Resolution 02





















Areas Where Informal Charges Remain Prevalent








A sizeable number of firms still face obstacles in complying with conditional business licensing procedures

Share of firms agreeing with each statement is under 60 percent















Level of familiarity with free trade agreements






COVID-19 poses major challenges to business operations




Unit: Share of Firms (%)

For the time, as many as 16,59% of firms reported planning to decrease or close operation – the highest level in the PCI history.



SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS

Local governments continue to promote proactivity and private sector support. Some core indicators of Proactivity record highest level of firm approval since 2006.

Anticorruption drive producing positive changes. The share of firms paying informal charges is on a decline. However, informal charges remain a challenge in several areas critical to business operation.

The efficiency of administrative procedures improved, leading to a reduced compliance burden. More reform efforts are needed to simplify procedures in tax, land, construction, and conditional business licensing.

Access to land and business premises remain an obstacle leading to firms delaying or cancelling business plans. Revision to the Land Law is necessary to lift bottlenecks in this important resource.

Only a small share of firms benefitted from programs under the Law on Support of Small- and Medium-sized Enterprises. Ministries and provincial governments should implement effectively and timely programs to facilitate business recovery, especially after the COVID-19 crisis.

Information and dissemination of guidance, and quality of legal documents implementing FTAs should be improved to help firms best take advantage of FTA benefits.



THE FUTURE OF PCI

The need to shift to **green economic development** is becoming increasingly critical, given Vietnamese people's increasing consciousness about environmental protection, and Vietnam's zero emission commitment.

In this context, **how can PCI contribute** to promote Vietnam's shift towards green economy?











THE PROVINCIAL GREEN INDEX

PGI measures business perceptions of provincial environmental governance, the level of readiness to make green investments at provinces, and promotes environmental friendly behavior and practices by businesses.



Goals: Provide evidence on environment quality, support provinces in screening investment projects. Create a motivation to promote green investments by businesses.



Mechanism: Engage private sector support, VCCI, USAID and Suntory PepsiCo Viet Nam are the founding partners of the PGI 2022-2024.



Activity: PGI will be implemented from 2022 as a part of PCI. Projected main activities: Development of the PGI, survey rollout, analyses of data, report write-up, dissemination of PCI to provinces.
